3 When is the CCA selection period?

Student will submit their selection between 8 February and 10 February 2021.
The deadline for submission is 10 February 2021, 5pm.

4 How will my child select CCA?

Students will be given four choices.
They are only allowed to choose two CCAs from the same category.

5 When will the students know the CCA allocation results?

The CCA allocation results will be release by the end of Term 1 Week 7.
Students will start attending CCA officially in Term 1 Week 8.

6 How is the Co-Curricular attainment calculated?

Co-Curricular attainment will be awarded in at the end of your child's graduating year, using the LEAPS 2.0 framework.

The framework is used to recognise secondary school students' holistic development. Students will be recognised with levels of attainment in four domains: Participation, Achievement, Leadership and Service.

7 How will the Co-Curricular attainment benefit my child for post-secondary education enrolment?

At the end of the graduating year, students' co-curricular attainment will be recognised according to Excellent/Good/Fair.

The level of attainment will be converted to bonus point(s) which can be used for admission to Junior Colleges/ Polytechnics/ Institutes of Technical Education (JC/Poly/ITE), if students meet the minimum eligible criteria for the course of study.
